<p>U6.1.1 Compare and contrast the United States in 1800 with the United States in 1898 focusing on similarities and differences in:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Territory, including the size of the United States and land use.• Population, including immigration, reactions to immigrants, and the changing demographic structure of rural and urban America• Systems of transportation (canals and railroads, including the Transcontinental Railroad) and their impact on the economy and society• Governmental policies promoting economic development (e.g. tariffs, banking, land grants, and mineral rights, the Homestead Act)• Economic change, including industrialization, increased global competition, and their impact on conditions of farmers and industrial workers• The treatment of African Americans, including the rise of segregation in the South as endorsed by the Supreme Court’s decision in Plessy v. Ferguson and the response of African Americans• The policies toward American Indians, including removal, reservations, the Dawes Act of 1887, and the response of American Indians.
