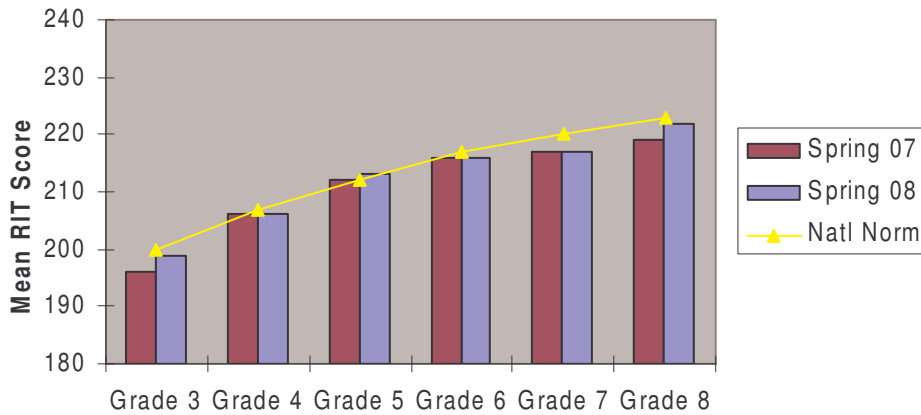


NWEA Reading Spring 2007 to Spring 2008

Our district uses computerized assessment through the Northwest Evaluation Association (NWEA). These assessments, known as Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) are conducted in grades K-8 in the fall and spring -- are state-aligned computerized adaptive tests that accurately reflect the instructional level for each student and measure growth over time in the areas of Mathematics and Reading. They provide our teachers with tools to identify any achievement gaps of their students and then design individual instruction. We are using the data gained through the assessments to drive instruction in our classrooms.
